- The General Municipal election for the City of Raymore for the offices of City Council will be held April 2, 2024. Filing for this election opened at 8 a.m. on Tuesday, Dec. 19, and continues through 5 p.m. on Jan. 16, 2024 (City Hall is closed Jan. 15). A \$20 filing fee is required at the time the candidate declares candidacy. • **LANDFILL UPDATE:** The Missouri Senate and House convened Jan. 3 for the first day of the Second Regular Session of the 102nd General Assembly. Multiple bills were filed relating to solid waste disposal area permits. We are closely watching Senate Bill 739 (Sen. Mike Cierpiot) and House Bill 1751 (Rep. Mike Haffner). The bills are similar to bills filed last year, which aim to extend the buffer between a landfill and an adjoining community to one full mile. Current legislation allows just a half mile.
