 Question P Open House: Noon-3 p.m. & 5-7:30 p.m., Wednesday, March 20 and 9 a.m.-noon & 5-7:30 p.m., Thursday, March 21 at Raymore City Hall, 100 Municipal Circle.

> Raymore residents will see Question P, a local use tax, on the April 2 ballot. A local use tax is equal to the City of Raymore's sales tax (2.5%) on the purchase of goods strictly from out-of-state vendors – often online – that



currently do not collect Raymore sales tax. Revenue from a local use tax will be used to hire more Police, Public Works Maintenance Workers and Parks Maintenance Workers to our workforce and will provide funds for yearly maintenance of Raymore's stretch of 58 Highway (while still allowing the City to invest more than \$2 million per year into the annual street preservation and curb replacement programs for residential streets and thoroughfares). 291 other Missouri cities have a voter-approved use tax in place to fund essential city services.
