- Ward Road construction starts April 1, 2024. Starting April 1, the first phase of construction will close the section of Ward Road between Chateau Place and Alexander Creek Drive for approximately four months. This will be the longest of three phases of construction due to the replacement of the bridge over Alexander Creek. Residents north of this closure will be detoured to 163rd Street to Prairie Lane. Residents south of this closure will detour from 58 Highway to Prairie Lane or M-291. Local access will be maintained for residences in between these streets. The The project will completely



reconstruct and upgrade Ward Road from 163rd Street to 58 Highway, adding:

- curbs and gutters
- stormwater improvements
- a new bridge
- street lights
- o a multi-use concrete pathway along the east side of Ward Road
- sidewalk connection on the west side between the neighborhoods of Alexander Creek, Chateau Place and Ward Park Place
