LANDFILL UPDATE: The Raymore City Council unanimously approved a settlement agreement at a special meeting Monday. This approval was the local step necessary to advance legislation at the state level to eliminate the threat of a landfill on Raymore's border. On Wednesday evening, the Missouri Senate approved HB 1751 in a 24-7 vote. The revised landfill bill now moves back to the Missouri House for final approval. 
