- **Fireworks information:** Fireworks tents begin sales on June 28. Raymore City Ordinance permits discharge of fireworks in city limits from 10 a.m. to 10 p.m. on July 1, 2 and 3, and from 10 a.m. to midnight on July 4. Fireworks are not allowed to be discharged in public streets, sidewalks or parks without authorization by the City Council. Bottle rockets, Roman candles and aerial luminaries (sky lanterns) are not allowed to be sold or used at any time within city limits. Call the Raymore Police Department at 816-331-0530 to report concerns and police will respond if they are not already responding to emergencies. Always call 911 in an emergency.
