- The Missouri Coalition for Roadway Safety wants to remind all drivers that the October Speed Enforcement Campaign is scheduled for Oct. 5-19. During this time law enforcement, including the Raymore Police Department, will be actively enforcing Missouri's speed limit laws and reminding drivers of the increased risks associated with higher speeds. There is a reason for posted speed limits the safety of all road users. "Saving a few extra minutes on your commute is not worth the increased risk of being involved in a crash that could endanger your own life or the lives of everyone else on the road," Jon Nelson, chair of the executive committee of the coalition said. "Speed is one of the most common contributing factors for fatal



crashes in Missouri and, unfortunately, the data shows it's only becoming more prevalent. We want to change that."
