- City Hall and Centerview will be closed on Monday, Oct. 14 for all-staff training.
- MONDAY, OCT. 14: A contractor for the City of Kansas City, Missouri, will be connecting a new water main to an existing water main starting at 10 a.m. on Monday, Oct. 14. The water main tie-in will impact water service to Raymore water customers, with lower water pressure likely throughout the day. Water will still be available and flowing through the water main to Raymore's water tower, however it will not be pumped in at usual.

Residents and businesses may experience a loss in water pressure for approximately 8-10 hours on Monday, starting at 10 a.m.

In order to lessen the impact to the community, residents and businesses are asked to conserve water and avoid using irrigation or sprinkler systems on Monday, Oct. 14.
