



Community Development

- Sean Siebert filed an application to <u>reclassify the zoning</u> of 9.29 acres of property known as Heritage Hills Lots 136 thru 157 from "R-1" Single Family Residential District to "R-2" Two-Family Residential District. The property is located between Pine Street and Foxwood Drive, east of North Madison Street. A "Good Neighbor" informational meeting will be at 6 p.m. on Jan. 25 in the City Council Chambers.
- Associate Planner David Gress commenced work on the Community for All Ages plan for the City. Completion of a comprehensive plan of action is the next step in the initiative to make the city a community where individuals of all ages will want to live, work and play.

Parks & Recreation
