- Staff held a bid opening on Tuesday, May 9, for residential waste collection services. Six area vendors submitted proposals for consideration.

Parks & Recreation

- Park staff planted new flowers in the landscaping at City Hall and mulched and planted flower beds around the city. Park staff also trimmed and cleaned up many of the original trees on the property of Centerview.
- Parks & Recreation Director Nathan Musteen, Recreation Superintendent John McLain and Parks Superintendent Steve Rulo met with the design team for Hawk Ridge Park to finalize the locations and plans of Hawk Ridge Park. Hawk Ridge Park Improvements are scheduled to begin later this summer. The project is part of the voter approved bond issues that passed in April 2016.
