Community Development

- The Planning & Zoning Commission met Tuesday and recommended denial of the request to reclassify the zoning of Heritage Hills Lots 158 thru 175. The applicant placed a hold on further review of the application in order to prepare a master plan for development of the property.
- Staff met with representatives of the Police Department, Cass County Health Department, South Metropolitan Fire Protection District and Pathways Community Health to discuss concerns related to hoarding and to identify assistance and resources available.

Finance

- The Capital Improvement Committee met on Monday, May 15, to develop transportation capital projects for the next five years.
- Staff met with various departments to assist with their FY 2017 year-end projections.
- Staff opened and reviewed bid proposals for bad debt collection services and annual auditing on Thursday, May 18.

Parks & Recreation

- Recreation & Parks staff prepared the grounds around Johnston Lake at Hawk Ridge Park for the Missouri Department of Conservations Fishing Classes being held Saturday.
- Parks staff patched and repaired the roof on the Park House. Some shingles and a roof cap were damaged following recent storms.
- Parks staff completed concrete work for ballards at Recreation Park Baseball Complex entrance. Staff also constructed a new drainage system between baseball fields three and four to remove standing water issues at the entrances.
- Park Superintendent Steve Rulo and Crew Leader Jeff Schmill conducted interviews for the final open seasonal position.
- Recreation staff finalized and posted on the website the youth recreational baseball and softball game schedule, youth volleyball end-of-season tournament schedule, and the youth recreational soccer end-of-season tournament schedule.

Police

Public Works

- As weather permitted, contractors put the primer coat of paint on the Foxwood Water Tower. The final, darker blue, coat will be done next week.
- Street crews continue to patch and repair Kurzweil Road.
- Crews completed the pipe installation on Gore Road. Next week crews will be installing
 the connection points and meter vaults that will connect the new water main to the
 existing Kansas City Water Department water main. This project will expand our capacity
 and allow the City to bring in an additional 1 million gallons of water to meet the needs of
 our growing community.
- Staff is preparing to open and review bids for the sidewalk and parking improvements at T.B. Hanna Station. This project will add sidewalks and parking on Maple St. between Washington and Adams streets.
