The following weekend, Saturday, Aug. 5, crews will return to restripe the lanes and add angled public parking around Municipal Circle. This will also turn Municipal Circle into a one-way street. Signage will be installed to inform drivers of the



change. Be aware that as you approach Municipal Circle after Aug. 5, you will only be able to make a right-hand turn from Skyline or Broadmoor Drive.
