
Upcoming

Community Development

- The Board of Adjustment met Tuesday and approved the variance application filed by Brian Wade to reconstruct the fence at 1706 Quail Court.
- The Planning & Zoning Commission met Tuesday and recommended approval of four applications: Westbrook at Creekmoor 13th plat; rezoning of 118-216 W. Walnut Street to C-2 (General Commercial); rezoning of 9.2 acres at the Northwest corner of Dean Avenue and North Cass Parkway to C-2 (Regional Commercial); and the 26th amendment to the Unified Development Code.
- An application for site plan approval was filed for the proposed construction of the amphitheater, pavilion/restroom facilities, and parking lot expansion in Hawk Ridge Park. The Planning & Zoning Commission will consider the application on Dec. 19. This project is part of the voter-approved bond projects. To learn more, visit www.Raymore.com/BondProjects.

- Staff is busy working on year end and preparing for the annual financial audit that will begin in December.
- Staff is working with the utility billing software to address the recent change in the utility deposit and applying the appropriate amounts back to customer accounts.

Parks & Recreation

- Staff discussed decoration layout, event details and final plans this week as Recreation Coordinator Katie Pattrick continued preparation for the upcoming Mayor's Christmas Tree Lighting scheduled at T.B. Hanna Station on December 1.
- Details and plans are being finalized for the upcoming Winter/Spring Parks and Recreation Program Guide. The upcoming guide set to hit Raymore mailboxes the first week of January will include a new line-up of senior programming along with the youth baseball/softball and soccer league sign-up information.
- Athletic Coordinator Todd Brennon is preparing for the upcoming youth basketball league coaches meeting on Nov. 30. Equipment, team rosters and facility schedules are being finalized. Practices will begin the week of Dec. 4.
- Contractors began work on the Memorial Park improvements. These improvements include new trails, expanded parking and other amenities. You can learn more about the project at our website.
