10. New Business. First Readings.

A. Delinquent Occupational Licenses (Hearing)

Mayor Turnbow opened the hearing at 8:00 p.m. and called for a staff report.

City Clerk Jeanie Woerner stated this item before Council is to consider certain actions pertaining to delinquent occupational licenses of business located within the City. Requirements for occupational licenses, which expire December 31 of each year, are outlined Chapter 605 of the Raymore City Code. Notice of the original hearing on March

26 was sent to each business owner by regular and certified mail as provided for in City Code Section 605.040 (B)(2)(b). With the cancellation of the March 26 Council meeting, phone calls were made to each business owner notifying them the hearing was rescheduled for this meeting.

This hearing provides an opportunity for business owners to address the City Council and provide defense or evidence as to why penalty sanctions should not be imposed. Since publication of the Council materials, LaserEquip, located at 208 Sunrise Dr., has been removed as a subject of this hearing.

Staff recommends that any business deemed by the Council after this hearing to be found in violation of City Code Chapter 605, to authorize the City Clerk to send a letter giving the businesses ten (10) business days to comply with Chapter 605, and advise the business owner that if compliance does not occur within that time frame, a misdemeanor citation will be issued through Raymore Municipal Court and the City Attorney may seek action in the Circuit Court to restrain, correct or abate continued operation of the business as provided for in City Code Section 605.040. General questions of Council were answered.

Lori O'Malley, owner of Freedom Stop, 503 E. Walnut stated her sales tax license encompasses both the convenience store and restaurant located at 501 E. Walnut. She wrongfully submitted tax information to the Missouri Department of Revenue for two locations. Ms. O'Malley requested an extension to April 23, 2018 before sending the 10 day letter.

Jeanette Singleton, owner of The Pit Grill and Bar, 1242-46 W. Foxwood Dr., explained her difficulty in obtaining the letter of No Tax Due due to auto pay issues with the state. She has hired a tax company to intervene with the state, but they are waiting on the state to approve the power of attorney for the tax company. Ms. Singleton requested an extension to April 23, 2018 before sending the 10 day letter.

Councilmembers asked questions regarding procedure and options of City Manager Jim Feuerborn and City Attorney Jonathan Zerr.

Mike Horn, owner of Polymer Systems at 106 Evans Ave, stated they are a newer business and ran into personal property and real estate tax issues, and other financial difficulties. They have secured funding to pay the taxes and have made arrangements to avoid these issues in the future. Mr. Horn requested an extension to April 23, 2018 before sending the 10 day letter.

Mayor Turnbow asked for further testimony and hearing none, closed the hearing at 8:28 p.m.

MOTION: By Councilmember Abdelgawad, second by Councilmember Berendzen to authorize the City Clerk to provide the ten (10) day notice to the delinquent business owners and if compliance is not met, direct the issuance of a citation through Raymore Municipal Court, and to wait for 2 weeks before providing the ten (10) day notice to Freedom Stop, The Pit Grill and Bar, and Polymer Systems.

DISCUSSION: Councilmember Holman spoke against a delay in issuing the 10 day notice to any of the businesses. He noted that the license should have been taken care of by December 31, 2017.

Councilmember Kellogg noted that the businesses would be able to request an appearance before Council at the next meeting if they are not able to rectify the situation.

Councilmember Townsend stated the timeline of reminders of renewal should have initiated the process, then the businesses had a reprieve due to the cancellation of the March 26 Council meeting. He stated he would not support an extension.

Councilmember Abdelgawad said that 10 extra days for these businesses is not an unreasonable way to support them. She expressed gratitude for the businesses that are able to obtain their licenses on time.

Councilmembers Burke and Circo spoke against allowing an additional 10 days.

Discussion ensued.

MOTION TO AMEND: By Councilmember Barber, second by Councilmember Kellogg to authorize the City Clerk to issue the ten (10) day notice to the delinquent business owners and if compliance is not met, direct the issuance of a citation through Raymore Municipal Court, and to place Freedom Stop, The Pit Grill and Bar, and Polymer Systems on the April 23 Council Agenda should they need additional time.

Councilmember Holman stated he can support the amendment to allow the businesses a last chance to complete the process.

Councilmember Circo urged businesses to be more proactive in the future to avoid these issues.

B. Morningview Infrastructure Acquisition

BILL 3356: "AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF RAYMORE, MISSOURI AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO AN ASSET ACQUISITION AGREEMENT WITH THE MORNINGVIEW HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATION, INC., FOR THE ACCEPTANCE OF PRIVATE INFRASTRUCTURE SUBJECT TO CERTAIN CONDITIONS."

City Clerk Jeanie Woerner conducted the first reading of Bill 3356 by title only.

City Attorney Jonathan Zerr provided a review of the staff report included in the Council packet. The City Council and City staff have been meeting with representatives of the Morningview Subdivision and homeowners association (HOA). The subdivision has requested that the City assume ownership and maintenance of their private streets, curbs, and street lights. The HOA is requesting the City finance the work which needs to be completed to bring the curbs up to City standards. The agreement with the HOA provides that reimbursement for the costs will be made in an initial payment of \$65,000 and the remaining costs will be paid to the City over an annual period of 10 years. If approved, this Bill authorizes execution of the agreements necessary for the City to acquire this infrastructure.

Mr. Feuerborn stated the lineal footage costs have been reviewed by staff based on comparable projects and staff feels comfortable with the estimated costs which include a 10% contingency.
