



- New home construction remains active. With 31 permits issued in May, a total of 106 permits for the year have been issued, surpassing last years total of 88.

Police

- Chief Jan Zimmerman met with Rockhurst University Chief of Police Randy Hopkins to discuss communications, peer support and other policy issues.
- Capt. Jim Wilson, Communications Director Mike Ekey, Public Works Director Mike Krass and Chief Jan Zimmerman met with Ray-Pec Assistant Superintendent Dr. Bryan Pettengill to discuss school zone speeds, restricted parking and other safety measures.

Public Works

- With the assistance of the Communications Department approximately 400 notices were distributed to contractors informing them of new right of way permit requirements. Effective June 1, 2018, all single-family home permits will be required to obtain a right-of-way permit. There will be no cost associated with this permit for single family home construction.
- Work continues on the annual Curb Replacement Project.
