Police

- Animal Control Officer Bailey Romi was selected to attend the World Vet Scholarship program in Ecuador to provide low cost veterinary services.
- The Drone Deployment Team met to discuss policies, procedures and team responsibilities.
- Capt. Jim Wilson met with Public Works and Communications Director Mike Ekey to discuss traffic flow during the installation of permeable pavers at selected crosswalk locations.
- Chief Jan Zimmerman met with the Greater Kansas City Public Safety Credit Union CEO Selection Committee to discuss finalists for the position.

Public Works

- Street Preservation work continues with patching on Kurzweil. Crack sealing also continues in residential neighborhoods before the micro-surfacing is applied.
- The 155th St. bridge construction is still on schedule. Crews are regrading dirt around the bridge.
- The curb contractor has been working in Ward Park Place and it will continue next week.
- Operations started street sweeping as our second installment of the three-part annual sweepings.
- Operations is continuing sewer jetting, meter conversions and mud-jacking.
- Engineering met with Gridiron construction concerning the permeable paving crosswalk project.
