# **Community Development**

- Officials announced this week that Raymore was one of 129 communities in the country to receive the AARP Community Challenge Grant Through this grant, a new paved and stamped ADA crosswalk will be added to Municipal Circle in front of the Centerview event space to improve safety for pedestrians, bicyclists and motorists, and to increase connectivity between nearby businesses and City Hall. - The Planning & Zoning Commission met Tuesday and recommended approval of ten of the twelve changes suggested by staff as part of the 28th amendment to the Unified Development Code. City Council will consider the amendments on Aug. 27.
- Associate Planner David Gress participated in the Mid-America Regional Council Solid Waste Management Board meeting.
- The Board of Appeals met Wednesday and voted to uphold the determination made by the Building Official regarding a code provision applicable to the construction work being done at 103 S. Washington Street.

- Administrative staff worked with Straub Construction on warranty items at Centerview.

- Recreation Staff have been finalizing the upcoming fall program guide. The guide will be delivered to all Raymore households in September with new programs, new instructors, new facilities along with our traditional programs and leagues.

- Park Staff have been working with contractors at the Raymore Activity Center to install the trees and plantings in the landscape areas.
