

- The Planning and Zoning Commission met Tuesday and recommended denial
 of a request for a Conditional Use Permit for a home-based business sign to
 be placed at 1000 E. Hubach Hill Road. The Commission recommended
 approval of the 29th amendment to the Unified Development Code that
 proposes to increase the minimum width of sidewalk in new subdivision
 phases to five feet. Both applications will be considered by the City Council
 on Dec. 10.
- A "Good Neighbor" meeting will be held Wednesday, Nov. 14 at 6:30 p.m. in the City Council Chambers at City Hall on the request to reclassify the zoning of 80 acres located on the north side of Hubach Hill Road, east of Stonegate Subdivision, from "R-1P" Single-Family Planned Residential District to "R-2" Single and Two-Family Residential District to allow for the <u>Brookside South</u> development be constructed.
