Staff answered general questions from residents during a good neighbor meeting held on September 19 which are included in the staff report. At its October 2, 2018, meeting the Commission voted 8-1 to accept staff proposed findings of fact and forward this case to the City Council with a recommended of approval.

Councilmember Holman asked if the extension of Ridgeway Drive to Fox Ridge Drive and the proposed future second entrance are outlined in the memorandum of understanding.

Mr. Cadoret explained the extension of Ridgeway Drive is planned when the commercial property to the north, separate from this application, is developed. As part of the site plan approval, a temporary access drive for emergency vehicles, will be available from the Ridgeway Villas townhomes to the west. For long term, the site plan does address permanent access from the commercial development to Ridgeway Drive when it is constructed for a second access point.

The rezoning application will need to be approved before the preliminary plat is approved. Because the preliminary plat is approved by Resolution, staff is requesting consideration of Resolution 18-62 be continued to the next Council meeting.

Ms. Phaben stated the existing treescape to the west won't be disturbed and they are dedicated to replace any trees that are destroyed by transplanting. They anticipate construction to begin in the Spring of 2019 with build out taking approximately 20 months.

The original public hearing notice to the taxing districts placed the public hearing at this meeting. Copies of the revised plan will be sent to the taxing districts to reflect the 2020 completion date. The notice to taxing jurisdictions on the revised plan indicated the second reading would be held on November 12, 2018. Because November 12 is a recognized holiday and no Council meeting will be held, further notice will be sent to the taxing districts for a public hearing and consideration will be held at the next Council meeting in November.

Councilmember Holman noted the undeveloped land generates minimal tax income. When the project is developed, it will increase the taxes received by the taxing districts. Mr. Douglas provided further explanation of the steps in the increase of tax income over the period of the bond and security of same.
