Please check your biodegradable bags and rebag or double bag any that have started decomposing on the bottom to ensure they don't rip when collectors pick up the bags to load. All limbs are required to be securely bundled in bundles less than 18 inches in diameter. The maximum length should be 36 inches and bundles should not weigh more than 60 pounds.
